### Keynote Speakers information

#### **Iain Patton (CEO of the EAUC)**

Iain was the first dedicated Environmental Officer in a UK college. He soon became an EAUC trailblazer working as the part-time administrative officer, supporting the writing and realisation of a business plan for the charity. As the organisation grew and gained momentum, Iain became the EAUC’s first Chief Executive in September 2005 and is THE face of the EAUC!



**Professor Tim O’Riordan,  
(Sustainability  
Knowledge Alliance and  
Future Earth)**

Professor Tim O’Riordan is Emeritus Professor of Environmental Sciences at the University of East Anglia. He is a former Sheriff of Norwich, is a Deputy Lieutenant of the County and Norfolk, a Fellow of the British Academy, and was awarded an OBE in 2010.

Professor O’Riordan has edited a number of key books on the institutional aspects of global environmental change, policy and practice, and two editions of the text book, Environmental Science for Environmental Management. His research deals with themes associated with better governance for sustainability. He is also active in the evolution of sustainability science partnerships especially under the Future Earth banner. He is a special advisor to the Commons’ Environment Audit Committee and heads the UK Sustainability Knowledge Alliance.

His direct work relates to designing future coastlines in East Anglia and in Portugal and in redesigning the regulatory and financial framework for sustainable water management in England. He is a founding Trustee of Norfolk Can Inspire, a social enterprise charity for assisting young people in Norfolk attain leadership qualities and opportunities.

**Dr Tim (Mac) Macartney  
(Embercombe)**

Tim ‘Mac’ Macartney is a leadership development consultant and coach, and the founder of Embercombe. Embercombe is a charity and social enterprise that champions a socially just, environmentally sustainable, and spiritually fulfilling way of living. It welcomes individuals, families and organisations [www.embercombe.co.uk](http://www.embercombe.co.uk). Over a period of twenty years, Mac was mentored by a group of ‘metis’ Native Americans. This prolonged and challenging training has profoundly influenced his worldview and continues to inform all aspects of his work.

Most of Mac’s current work with organisations is focused towards inspiring and integrating values-led leadership. In the last year he has co-facilitated leadership, values, and sustainability workshops with INSEAD Business School (Singapore), the Lafarge Performance Team, P&G Fabric Care (Europe), PepsiCo, Nokia Siemens Networks, Budgens Supermarkets, and Lend Lease. He also leads a speaking and authentic presentation programme at Embercombe called ‘Speaking Out’ which, to date, has had participants from Coca Cola and Associated British Foods.

Mac is a member of the faculty delivering WWF International and IMD Business School’s ‘One Planet Leaders’ Programme in Lausanne, and regularly contributes to the innovative WWF/Exeter University Business School ‘One Planet Leaders’ MBA programme.

**David Pencheon OBE  
(Director NHS  
Sustainable  
Development Unit)**

David Pencheon is a UK trained doctor and is currently Director of the NHS Sustainable Development Unit (England).

David Pencheon was previously Director of a Public Health Observatory in Cambridge from 2001 to 2007. He has worked as a clinical doctor in the NHS, a joint Director of Public Health, a Public Health Training Programme Director in the East of England, with the NHS R&D programme, and in China in the early 1990s with Save the Children Fund (UK).

His main interests and areas of research and publication are: sustainable development, large scale transformational change, health and climate change, underpinning action and policy with good information and evidence, training and professional development, organisational development, medical informatics and decision support for health professionals.

He was awarded an OBE in the New Year’s Honours List 2012 for services to public health and the NHS.
