The University of York Students' Union won in 2007 for its collection and overhaul of abandoned bikes at the end of the academic year, and their auctioning in the next year to raise money for campaigning and charitable work in Africa - a scheme which is now being replicated elsewhere as a result of national publicity.



The University of Leeds won with its very successful recycling initiatives in 2006, and its continuous improvement programme in 2007. Environmental Manager Dr Keith Pitcher believes that 'the Awards have been of huge benefit in raising awareness, building support within the University, delivering significant & ongoing environmental improvements, and in enhancing our reputation.'
