Speakers



Anthony McClaran, Chief Executive, Quality Assurance Agency for Higher Education

Anthony has been Chief Executive of QAA since October 2009 and was previously Chief Executive of UCAS, based in Cheltenham. He has held numerous governance positions across the school and university sectors, was a member of the Council of the University of Gloucestershire (and its Chair from 2007-09) and a Governor of the National Star College. He was appointed Chair of the new All Saints' Academy in Cheltenham in 2011. From 2009-2011 he chaired the Employment and Skills Advisory Committee of Gloucestershire First (now GFirst) and served on its Board. He is a Freeman of the Company of Educators, a Member and Trustee of the Honourable Company of Gloucestershire, and a Trustee of the Summerfield Trust.



Prof. Lesley-Jane Eales-Reynolds, Pro Vice Chancellor (Education), Kingston University

Lesley-Jane's portfolio is wide ranging with responsibility for the implementation of every aspect of the institutional education strategy at Kingston University, including learning, teaching, quality assurance and enhancement, student support, academic practice and the student experience.

Prior to her joining Kingston, Lesley was the Director of Learning, Teaching and Pedagogic Research at the University of Westminster. In 2005, she created a Centre for Excellence in Teaching and Learning at the University of Portsmouth.

As Director of the ExPERT Centre, she led innovations in teaching in the health-related sciences.

A recipient of a National Teaching Fellowship in 2001, she became one of the first senior fellows of the Higher Education Academy in 2007. She is a founding member and Chair of the Association of National Teaching Fellows and a past board member of the Higher Education Academy.



Paul Turner, Group Community & Sustainable Business Director, Lloyds Banking Group

Paul Turner is Lloyds Banking Group's Director of Community & Sustainable Business. He is responsible for leading the team developing and implementing the Bank's community and sustainable development strategy. He is responsible for the Group's work with social enterprises, charities and NGOs. He is also responsible for the Group's community engagement, financial education, 'green economy' and business ethics programmes. Paul is a graduate of the Harvard Business School Advanced Management Program, a Senior Associate and Tutor at Cambridge University on their Programme for Sustainability Leadership, and a member of Dame Ellen MacArthur's expert advisory panel on the circular economy. Formerly, Paul was a on the steering group of the United Nations Environment Programme's Finance Initiative and a Trustee of Global Action Plan and Carbon Leapfrog.



David Bent, Deputy Director, Sustainable Business, Forum for the Future

As Deputy Director Paul leads the Sustainable Business Practice, which helps companies and public sector organisations succeed through sustainability. He runs change projects that deliver results for companies and the critical systems we all depend on.

Recent examples include Carillion's sustainability vision, innovation with eBay Europe, and embedding change at O2 UK. He is responsible for keeping the Forum's methods and thinking at the cutting edge, running the sustainable business team and raising their profile. He has a particular focus on sustainable business models, and the financial case for sustainability.

David enjoys the opportunity to work with committed companies, and the challenge of illuminating problems by connecting people with ideas, and to transform situations by engaging people so they can act.



Chris Mills, Ethical Policy Advisor, The Co-operative Bank

In 2006, the ethical and environmental functions of the Co-operative Group and Co-operative Banking Group (CBG) were amalgamated. Chris was appointed Ethical Policy Manager in the Social Goals and Sustainability Team and is primarily responsible for the development and implementation of the bank's Ethical Policy.

Chris joined the Co-operative Bank in 1997 and joined the then Ethical Policy Unit as an adviser in late 1999. Key outputs include: involvement in the delivery of the 2001 and 2009 Ethical Policy reviews; Extension of bank Ethical Policy to the former Britannia Building Society as part of the merger with CBG and the investments that underpin Co-operative Insurance products. Within the team Chris' role has extended beyond ethical finance to include working on animal welfare issues with Co-operative Food.



Tom Kelman, Director of Finance and Corporate Resources, AAT

Tom Kelman has been Director of Finance and Corporate Resources at AAT since July 2005.
