


About Aston University




- A University since 1966

– Target CO2 emissions: residential



Go Green Champion


Main Purpose of Role:






MB ABS - Out of hours / constant usage: 39 %

In order for ABS to meet next month's target, based on the same period last year, it needs to reduce its daily consumption by 206 kWh.

This is equivalent to 100 kgs of CO_2 that needs to be saved.


