### SDG Accord Report 2019

Progress towards the Global Goals in the University and College Sector

Officially launched at the United Nations during the High-level Political Forum - New York, July 2019

The second SDG Accord Report, <u>'Progress towards the Global Goals in the University and College sector'</u> was launched yesterday at the United Nation's Highlevel Political Forum (HLPF) in New York by the Global Alliance – a partnership of the world's universities, colleges and sustainability networks.

The research shows increasing prioritisation of Climate Action (SDG 13) in universities and colleges and recommends their leaders to commit to Net Zero Carbon Emissions or they risk falling behind institutions that recognise the seriousness of this situation.

### Higher and Further Education Institutions across the globe declare Climate Emergency









Networks representing more than 7,000 higher and further education institutions announced yesterday at the Higher Education Sustainability Initiative meeting in New York that they are declaring a Climate Emergency as set out in the <u>Global Climate Emergency Letter</u>. The purpose of the letter was to agree and undertake a three-point plan to address the climate crisis looking at:

- 1. Committing to going carbon neutral by 2030 or 2050 at the very latest;
- 2. Mobilizing more resources for action-oriented climate change research and skills creation;
- 3. Increasing the delivery of environmental and sustainability education across curricula, campus and community outreach programmes.


### Green Gown Awards Spotlight

Two years ago, they began with a clean sheet of paper to design a series of undergraduate and postgraduate programmes which are underpinned by sustainable and ethical and responsible thinking.



### Other Highlights



The University of Plymouth has declared a climate emergency, joining an international movement aimed at taking action on climate change.

As part of the commitment, the University will adopt a net zero emissions target (scope 1 and 2) by 2025, five years earlier than originally planned. It will continue efforts to increase recycling rates across its campus, reduce the amount of water used in its facilities, continue to reduce energy use and cut CO2 emissions.
