

The number one resource for sustainability in UK education

As always, the bank of excellence has been uploaded to the Sustainability Exchange to join the rest of the knowledge already hosted on the site. But, a visit to the site this year will be very different. Now, over two years from the launch, with 1100+ sustainability resources available we've really seen how this innovative, collaborative information portal has been utilised by the sector and how we can further develop it for years to come.

As we are no longer funded by HEFCE, this opens the door to a whole range of potential partners who have extensive sustainability resource banks under lock and key. This has allowed us to welcome partners from Scotland, Wales, N. Ireland as well as internationally and allows us to focus on much needed support for Further Education.

To bring in experience and insight from sustainable business, we have six sponsors from some of the leading businesses with strong sustainability strategies and offerings. These are: Interface, Schneider Electric, SITA UK, Tusker, TUCO and The Energy Consortium.

The site has had a bit of a makeover and is now even easier to find and share the knowledge and insight you need with intuitive searching. You can search by region, resource type, by Framework (as established by Learning in Future Environments) and many more. We're also planning more 'exchanges' – lunchtime webinars available for all on a range of sustainability topics.

Taking inspiration Take for example the University of Worcester's bike loan project offering an affordable and easy to administer scheme which is designed to promote cycling through minimising the barriers to staff and students. Partnering with a social enterprise where young people with learning disabilities can develop practical skills and manage the campus bike shop - which in-turn increases self-esteem, it identified a gap in the cycling provision and now operates a very successful scheme.

Being able to sell organic produce with "zero food miles" to students, staff and the local community is the essence of Roehampton's "Growhampton" project. From its edible campus, to its bee hives and The Hive sustainability café, this project offers opportunities to engage with sustainability as volunteers, ethical consumers, and through research, coursework and work experience. The Hive sources only local, organic and ethical produce, runs a weekly farmers' market and generates an income.
