Connecting teams of socially responsible student leaders with sustainability staff expertise and campus initiatives to enable real community impact.

Enactus is an international non-profit organisation dedicated to inspiring students to improve the world through entrepreneurial action. It connects students, academics and business leaders to create community development projects and social enterprises that put beneficiaries' ingenuity and talents at the centre of improving their own livelihoods.

The EAUC represents UK and Irish further and higher education institutions with over 2 million students and nearly 400,000 staff with a spending budget of over £25 billion. As an innovative alliance of staff, students, businesses and other stakeholders, it exists to lead and empower the post-16 education sector to make sustainability 'just good business'.

Enactus UK and EAUC have partnered together to connect EAUC members with Enactus campus teams to collaborate on finding solutions to societies biggest sustainability challenges. This partnership has seen the creation of a new institutional volunteering role, the **Enactus EAUC Sustainability Adviser (SA)**.

Every Enactus team is formed with an **Advisory Board** to support the development of the team and its projects. On this Board sit the **University Advisers (UAs)**, these are staff members from the university that volunteer to manage, coach and guide the Enactus team and students on their Enactus journey. The Sustainability Adviser is a new form of UA which exists to; 1) Connect student teams with existing sustainability initiatives on campus and 2) Provide sustainability insights and expert advice to existing Enactus projects (*find example project case studies here*).

Voluntary, flexible commitment

Key Attributes:

- Affinity with Enactus and its core youth social action mission
- Interest in providing students with a hands-on sustainability learning experience
- Ability to coach and mentor students on sustainability issues

Key Responsibilities:

1) Connect Enactus teams to existing institutional sustainability initiatives: Sustainability is often high on the agenda at universities and there tends to be a great range of activities undertaken throughout the year from sustainability, estates and academic departments as well as Student Unions (as demonstrated with the EAUC Green Gown Award finalists). EAUC sustainability leaders and Enactus teams are always looking for students to engage and new potential project areas and there would seem to be a natural fit and value add for both sides. The Sustainability Adviser seeks to 'connect the dots' and bring both parties together to explore areas of collaboration and mutual support.





2) Provide sustainability insights and expert advice to existing Enactus projects: Sustainability (social, economic and environmental) is key part of the Enactus Criterion that serves as the basic framework for all Enactus projects. Having an appointed Sustainability Adviser as an avenue of support will enable the Enactus team to review and improve the sustainability of their project solutions and ultimately scale their community impact.
