Auditor training session are now in full swing. So far we have trained up over 153 students and staff at 10 universities and colleges. In most instances audits were carried straight after the auditor training sessions to ensure that the process was still fresh for the trainee auditors and to reduce the administration required to organise audits. The sessions have been an enjoyable experience for both the trainees and for the Green Impact Project Officers who have been delivering them. The sessions are very interactive and enable students to start thinking critically about environmental impacts of university departments and ways

Tips for a successful awards ceremony

Lots of awards ceremonies have been planned for the coming weeks and months. A couple have even taken place already. An awards ceremony is a great opportunity to thank all the teams for all the hard work that they have been doing and reward them for their efforts. They also act as a great way of inspiring others to get involved. It is therefore important to plan your ceremonies carefully and ensure that the events get the publicity that they deserve. Here are some tips:

- Have the VC and/or senior management present—book their time early!
- Have a master of the ceremony to ensure the event runs smoothly.
- Book a room with elements of grandeur although make sure it's not too big so it doesn't look empty.
- Serve drinks (and food if possible) we want people to feel like they're at a party not a meeting!
- Arrange some nice awards—they don't have to be expensive to make your teams feel rewarded.
- Book a photographer and make sure they are well briefed. Awards events provide great publicity shots.
- Liaise with your Green Impact Project
