- **Rosa Murray**, Development Officer, Education, Teaching and Leadership, University of Edinburgh. Rosa is currently working in the University of Edinburgh as a Development Officer taking forward the agenda of Teaching Scotland's Future (2012) in partnership with the University and the their Local Authorities with a particular focus on Early Phase Professional Learning.

Rosa took up appointment with the General Teaching Council for Scotland (GTCS) in August 2004 where she was responsible for promoting and developing Professional Standards and Learning and Development Programmes for teachers in Scotland. Rosa led the development of Professional Values and Learning for Sustainability within the GTCS Professional Standards for teachers, this work was in partnership with Learning for Sustainability Scotland and the Scottish Government and embedded values and LfS throughout all the professional standards for teachers in Scotland.

Previous to her current post she was the Principal Teacher of Religious and Moral Education at St Augustine's High School. During her time there she was seconded for two years as Development Officer for Religious and Moral Education at the Education Department of Edinburgh City Council. She has also undertaken secondments with SQA and the Scottish Government.

She is also a regular contributor to Radio Scotland's Religious Affairs Broadcasting Programme 'Thought for Today' where she provides reflections, from a spiritual perspective, on current events and issues around the world.
