UN Decade of Education for Sustainable Development – Learning for Change

I am writing to all college and university Principals and other relevant stakeholders to seek support in realising the ambitions set out in Scotland's Action Plan for the second half of the UN Decade of Education for Sustainable Development, *Learning for Change*, which was launched on 26 May.

Learning for Change is unquestionably ambitious. It sets out how we aim to make improvements in education for sustainable development across Scotland, not just in our colleges and universities but in our schools, workplaces and local communities. In the further and higher education sectors, we hope education for sustainable development can be integrated into the core learning experience to help our young people cultivate sustainable literacy and citizenship skills for the future.

In developing the plan, we worked with a range of stakeholders including the Scottish Funding Council (SFC), the Higher Education Academy (HEA), the National Union of Students (NUS), Universities Scotland (US), Scotland's Colleges (SC), the Sustainable Development Commission Scotland (SDC), HM Inspectorate of Education (HMIE), the Quality Assurance Agency (QAA), the Environmental Association for Universities and Colleges (EAUC) and many others. I hope we will now all work together to deliver the outcomes set out in our Action Plan and your support in helping us achieve positive outcomes will be invaluable. There is much to celebrate in the college and university sectors, with positive progress in delivering the outcomes set for the first half of the decade, (and reflected in *Learning for our Future*). This progress is reflected in a recent report from SDC, which graded our progress in education for sustainable development with 4 marks out of a possible 5 and which said "Education is an area in which sustainability principles increasingly underpin policy in Scotland. The education sector in Scotland is becoming more sustainable in terms of its operations and underlying philosophies, though there remains room for improvement." By working together, I am sure we can build on our existing success over the next half of the decade and achieve even better results.

Learning for Change sets out 9 new actions for delivery in the further and higher education sectors over the next five years. They include:

- encouraging our colleges and universities to engage with schools to consider how sustainable development and global citizenship is being embedded through Curriculum for Excellence;
- working with students' associations and societies to ensure student involvement in estate development and the development of cultural and behavioural change; and
- encouraging the inclusion of sustainable development in expectations of new entrants to vocations and professions where appropriate.

One of the further action points in the Plan is the delivery of the Universities and Colleges Climate Commitment for Scotland (UCCCfS) which is being taken forward by EAUC, with funding from the SFC. I am delighted to note that, to date, 51 institutions have signed up to the commitment, representing over 80% of colleges and universities in Scotland . This is enormously encouraging, and I am sure that - through delivery of their five year climate change action plans - UCCCfS will have a positive impact on our aspirations for carbon reduction and the broader sustainability agenda.

Scotland's colleges and universities will play a key role in developing knowledge and understanding of sustainable development. Ultimately, the success of *Learning for Change* will depend on you committing to the achievement of our Action Plan.

Over the course of the next five years, as we strive to realise the ambitious targets we have set, I know I can rely you to work with us, and support the partner organisations involved, to deliver success. I am confident that, with your help, we can ensure Scotland remains a model of best practice in tackling sustainable development and leads the way for the future.

Thank you for your continued support and commitment.
